Community update July 2020

Major Earthworks for Western Sydney International continue

The Western Sydney International (Nancy-Bird Walton) Airport project will be one of the largest earthmoving challenges in Australian history and major earthworks are well underway, with 150 machines operating on the 1,780-hectare site.

Overall, around 25 million cubic metres of earth will be moved to make way for construction of the airport terminal, runway, roads and rail on what is a very hilly site – the difference between the highest and lowest points is equivalent to a 12-storey building.


This project is being delivered by the CPB Contractors and Lendlease Joint Venture (CPBLLJV) on behalf of Western Sydney Airport.

What's happening on-site?

- Moving 25 million cubic metres of earth;
- Aboriginal heritage works;
- Clearing and remediation;
- Removal of redundant utilities and fencing;
- Importation of sandstone from Sydney tunnelling projects; and
- Topsoil and landscaping works.

During June, the project team hit their first key milestone, moving one million cubic metres of earth since Major Earthworks began in March. Work has continued throughout the COVID-19 pandemic with strict social distancing and hygiene practices in place.

Construction continues during COVID-19

In response to COVID-19, the Major Earthworks team has implemented a range of measures to protect the health and safety of our workforce and the community. This month, the Major Earthworks fleet welcomed two of four 657 scrapers to site.

These machines are the biggest twin power scrapers available on the market and can carry 50T of material in the bowl – that is equivalent to 12 times the weight of a hippopotamus. Other new additions are three 60T Komatsu dump trucks.

The first of three 190T excavators (as seen above) arrived on site this month. This large piece of equipment is typically seen on large mining sites. The 190T excavators can excavate more earth per scoop compared to the smaller models and as such will be a welcome addition to the fleet. This excavator will be accompanied by our rigid dump trucks which arrive on site later this month.

The CAT 775 and CAT 777 rigid dump trucks will be used to cart around 10,500,000 cubic metres of earth around the site.

National Reconciliation Week Morning Tea

A morning tea was held and the team sampled wattle seed and macadamia triple choc brownies and mini emu masala sausage rolls with native mint raita.
